Directions:

NOTE: Vehicle's surface must be wet when using this product. To avoid streaking, do not use in direct sunlight or allow product to dry on surface.

- 1. Shake well before use.
- 2. Using a spray bottle, mist HYDRA BEAD onto an area of the vehicle.
- 3. Rinse that same area.
- 4. Use a Drying Blade or microfiber towel to wipe-up any remaining water.
- 5. Repeat steps 2,3 and 4 until entire vehicle is dry.

FIRST AID: EYE CONTACT: Rinse eyes cautiously with lukewarm, gently flowing water for 15 minutes, while holding the eyelids open. Remove contact lenses, if present and easy to do. Take care not to rinse contaminated water into unaffected eye or onto the face. If eye irritation persists: Get medical advice/attention.

SKIN CONTACT: Wipe off with a towel. Wash with soap and water. Get medical attention if irritation persists.

INHALATION: Remove source of exposure or move person to fresh air and keep comfortable for breathing. If breathing is difficult, trained personnel should administer emergency oxygen if advised to do so by the POISON CENTER/doctor. If breathing has stopped, trained personnel should begin rescue breathing or, if the heart has stopped immediately start cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) or automated external defibrillation (AED). If you feel unwell/if concerned: Get medical advice/attention.

INGESTION: Rinse mouth. Give two glasses of water. If you feel unwell or if concerned: Get medical attention. Do NOT induce vomiting unless under the advice of doctor or POISON CENTER. NOTE: Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious or convulsing victim. Keep person warm and quiet.
