To remove foul odors:

- Shake container before use.
- Spray or mist lightly onto carpeting, under seats, upholstery and in air vents.

FIRST AID:

IF IN EYES: Rinse eyes cautiously with lukewarm, gently flowing water for 15 minutes, while holding the eyelids open. Remove contact lenses, if present and easy to do. Take care not to rinse contaminated water into unaffected eye or onto the face. If eye irritation persists: Get medical advice/attention.

FOR INHALATION: Remove source of exposure or move person to fresh air and keep comfortable for breathing. If breathing is difficult, trained personnel should administer emergency oxygen if advised to do so by the POISON CENTER/doctor. If breathing has stopped, trained personnel should begin rescue breathing or, if heart has stopped, immediately start cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) or automated external defibrillation (AED). If you feel unwell/if concerned: Get medical advice//attention.
